



### PAPA'S VISION FOR HOLISTIC CHILD HEALTHCARE TAKES CENTER-STAGE AT THE STRATEGIC PLANNING EVENT

The Philippine Ambulatory Pediatric Association (PAPA) convened its strategic planning event for 2023–2024 on August 17, 2023, at the Unilab Small Cafeteria, Bayanihan Hall, United Laboratories, Mandaluyong City. The event saw the participation of the officers and heads of various advocacy committees, as well as chapter presidents of the organization. They shared their achievements and plans for the future.

The event was graced by Dr. Mutya San Agustin, founding president of PAPA, who has consistently influenced the organization with her dedication and vision. She delivered her message of support via Zoom, where she was introduced as "itinakda ng Maylikha sa isang banal na adhika," borrowing a line from the PAPA hymn.

Dr. Edilberto Boying Garcia emphasized "Training and education of healthcare providers in ambulatory settings" in his Program Overview. He echoed PAPA's vision of promoting holistic, innovative, and socially responsive healthcare for children at home, in school, and within the community.

The planning centered around the following key elements: program reach and participation, program effectiveness and impact, resource management, collaboration and partnerships, and evaluation and continuous improvement. These elements align with the organization's mission to deliver quality ambulatory pediatric care through education, research, advocacy, and networking.

A highlight of the event was the report from Dr. Margarita Alfonso, the president of PAPA and the chair of the research committee. She expressed her aspiration to cultivate a culture of research within the organization. This aims not only to raise awareness among parents, educators, and communities about the significance of holistic and innovative child healthcare practices but also to eventually influence policy decisions and legislation in favor of comprehensive, innovative, and socially responsive approaches to child healthcare. She believes that initiating with small research questions will initiate the program.

Welcome Remarks by Dr Margarita Alfonso, PAPA President



Dr. Joan Millonado, the vice president of PAPA, closed the event by reiterating Dr. Alfonso's challenge to the organization. The concept of interprofessional education and collaboration also known as IPEC, and the role it plays in UHC was be introduced by our speaker from the academe, Michael P. Sy, PhD, MHPEd, OTRP. Discussions on the primary care principles in the clinical practice followed, such as updates in newborn screening program the developmental screening were tackled by Dr. Michelle E. Abadingo and Dr. Lourdes Bernadette S. Tanchanco, esteemed specialists genetics and developmental pediatrics respectively.

PAPA's very own advocacies were likewise highlighted in this year's convention, particularly on adolescent vaping and the different parenting models. These topics were expertly discussed by Dr. Rizalina H. Gonzalez and Karina Therese G. Fernandez, PhD. An engaging panel discussion on the multidisciplinary and holistic management offered by the child protection services team was also undertaken. The final lecture by Dr. Anna Guia O. Limpoco gave us the direction of the primary pediatric practice including innovations brought about by technology.

The 2-day virtual event was attended by over 1,500 participants composed of doctors, nurses, medical students, social workers, WCPU personnel from all over the Philippines. There were also attendees from the USA, Saudi Arabia, UAE, Qatar, Taiwan, and Australia. As we aspire to attain a health care system that genuinely provides "health for all", the organizing committee would like to extend our heartfelt gratitude to all participants, our advisers, and sponsors in our quest to expand the horizons in child health.



# ACCELERATING CERVICAL CANCER ELIMINATION INITIATIVES IN THE PHILIPPINES


To celebrate National Adolescent Immunization Month, the Philippine Ambulatory Pediatric Association, Inc. conducted an informative, engaging webinar on August 31, 2023, in collaboration with Jhpiego Philippines and Merck, Sharp, and Dohme Philippines. Dr. Ingrid Magnata, Country Program Manager of Jhpiego Philippines, discussed the Current Status of Cervical Cancer Elimination Initiatives in the Philippines. She emphasized the global burden of cervical cancer and its standing as the second leading cause of death among women, shedding light on the interventions undertaken by Jhpiego and other stakeholders to close gaps and effectively leverage resources for accelerating the elimination of cervical cancer as a public health concern.



Dr. Erlinda Susana Cuisia-Cruz then addressed The Role of the Physician in Overcoming Barriers to HPV Vaccination. To tackle obstacles such as lack of awareness and misinformation, Dr. Cuisia-Cruz recommended increasing culturally tailored health literacy initiatives addressing HPV vaccination gaps. She stressed the importance of positive recommendations for HPV vaccination from healthcare providers and allied healthcare workers.



Following this, Dr. Anthony Calibo, Technical Human Advisor of the Papilloma Virus Vaccine Acceleration Program Partners Initiative (HAPPI) Project of Jhpiego Philippines, provided updates on the Status of Primary Prevention and Promotion of HPV Vaccination. The HPV vaccination program in the Philippines has been gradually introduced from 2015 to the present through community-based and school-based immunization campaigns. Dr. Calibo also presented the challenges in the program's implementation, including vaccine supply shortages, financial constraints, vaccine hesitancy, and disruptions to healthcare services, resulting in low vaccine coverage.




Dr. Ruby Punongbayan-Tan moderated an open forum during which it was emphasized that HPV vaccination is recommended for all healthy girls as a two-dose series (0, 6-12 months) at ages 9 through 14 years. A three-dose series (0, 1-2, 6 months) is recommended for individuals initiating vaccination at ages 15 through 45 years and for immunocompromised individuals. The discussion underscored the power of prevention through HPV vaccination and the significance of cervical screening and vaccination recommendations from healthcare providers.

The webinar provided us with a wealth of information, statistics, ideas, and visions to ponder. We conveyed our message to a diverse group of participants, including educators, students, trainees, midwives, nurses, pharmacists, physicians, and parents from different parts of the country. We urged them to unite in response to the global call for accelerated efforts to eliminate cervical cancer by promoting strategies for HPV vaccination among young girls. The ADVOCACY CALL is crystal clear. Let us collectively champion HPV vaccination and work together to forge a more equitable future for today's children.
